

Tax Information for Immigrants

Tax season can be a frustrating time for many people but it can be especially confusing for immigrants to the United States. Do you need to file federal taxes? Apply For a Social Security Number

In general, only immigrants who have permission to work from the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) can apply for a Social Security Number (SSN). Find out how to apply for an SSN.

Determining Alien Tax Status

You may be considered a resident alien of the U.S. by the IRS even if you are not a lawful permanent resident or do not hold a green card. The IRS explains how to determine your alien tax status if you are not a U.S. citizen.

Taxation of Resident and Nonresident Aliens

Nonresident aliens are generally subject to U.S. income tax only on their U.S. source income while resident aliens are generally taxed in the same way as U.S. citizens.
